Welshmill Park

We have been involved in discussions with Chris Stringer, who has replaced Simon Woollen at Frome Town Council, about developments at Welshmill. Tess has organised quotations for new play equipment. Peter Baker, the Landscape Architect who devised the original 'Masterplan', and Alice McColl as well as Chris have been involved in evaluating the proposals. FTC has funding available for this project, and we hope that the equipment will be in place by the summer.



FTC has arranged for much-needed re-surfacing work to be carried out on the Pump Track by local organisation Mindset. A couple of bike enthusiasts have advised on the work to be undertaken and are keeping an eye on what is actually done, so that we will still have the best Pump Track in the South West! The outer tarmac ring has been connected up so that will offer the littlest riders a complete circuit.

Things are moving, but incredibly slowly. Mendip DC has decided to ask the public to comment on the transfer to FTC of their lease for part of the site, and Somerset CC also feels that consultation is needed before they can allow us to withdraw the Village Green Application.
