Welshmill Park

Frome Town Council has provided a fantastic children's play trail and a mound with tunnel at Welshmill Park. The play trail circles around the see-saw on the river side of the play-park, and includes all sorts of timber structures for climbing, balancing, crawling and jumping around. We hope all ages from toddlers upwards will find something to challenge them! The mound with a tunnel through it is positioned between the baby swings and the sandpit and even tinies are having fun both crawling through the tunnel and climbing up and over the mound.





FROGS representatives helped choose the supplier - Vitaplay - and the design of the trail. We are very grateful to the Town Council for funding and managing the project.

Plans are being laid to celebrate this great new addition to Welshmill Park - a community picnic in conjunction with Fair Frome will be held on Saturday 29 August, with children's activities. FROGS will use the occasion to consult everyone about our ideas for willow structures at Welshmill or possibly the Showfield - we need to know what sort of structures people would like and where they should go.

Frome's Second Children's Festival

The 2015 Children's Festival took place on Sunday 12 July at Victoria Park and on the Mary Baily playing field. There was a huge range of activities and entertainment for everyone. It is estimated that around 3,000 people attended and there were queues all day for the monkey bridge, archery and the smoothy bike. The Imaginary Menagerie drew crowds for each performance. Wildlife Walks

Dan Lupton led a fascinating bird-identification walk through Willow Vale and Rodden Meadow on Midsummer Day and helped us learn to recognise the flight of swifts, jack-daws, house-martins, pigeons and carrion-crows, as well as the calls of blackbirds, wrens, song-thrushes, chiff-chaff, black-caps, magpies, great-tits, long-tailed tit and wood-pigeon.

On Saturday 8 August Mick Ridgard will lead a Moth and Butterflies walk at East Woodlands. Meet at the church at 2pm, but as there is a wedding scheduled for 3pm we are asking those coming by car to park down the lane to the right of the church - this will be signposted.

Fund-raising for the Missing Link

Congratulations to FROGS' Trustee Marjory Hatvany who has cycled from Lands End to John O'Groats, in aid of the Missing Link project. £20,000 is needed to access funding of £200,000 for Phase II of the project, which will ultimately create a traffic-free cycle path from Frome to the Colliers' Way at Great Elm. This level route - mostly on the line of a disused railway - will help cyclists and walkers to get out into the countryside to enjoy the physical and mental health benefits of exercise and fresh air. Marjory set herself a target of £1,000, but hopes to exceed this.
