Shared Earth Learning and The Tree Project Frome, in conjunction with FTC, are organising a fantastic afternoon based around the planting of a selection of small native trees and bushes at Weylands, Frome (beside the river on the Missing Link cyclepath north of Whatcombe Road). The easiest way to find it is by following the cyclepath from Welshmill Lane away from the town centre, between the Gracewell care home and the river.

Please come along and help with the planting of hazel, hawthorn, guelder rose, elder, willow, dogwood and other native species. The trees, tools and refreshments are provided, but you may like to bring gardening gloves and wear stout shoes or boots.

There will be activities for children and adults, including a foraging walk, tree quiz, and information on the medicinal uses of trees.
